Dear Trinity Friends and Family,

On Saturday, January 27th, the Shared Leadership Team (SLT) gathered in retreat at Trinity for worship, learning, dreaming, and fellowship. It was a remarkable day of dreaming and discerning where God is calling Trinity to go in 2024 and beyond.



Our day began with worship in the Chapel as we heard from Matthew 13 and what the Kingdom of God looks like from Jesus. During our first session Listening to God's Call, we looked at call stories in scripture and the implications of those call stories in our lives as people of God and as a congregation. We took the time to refamiliarize ourselves with Reggie McNeal's book Kingdom Come: Why We Must Give Up Our Obsession with Fixing the Church--and What We Should Do Instead. Our mid-morning session focused on Expanding Engagement in Our Mission and we looked at how best to care for ourselves and support volunteers in ministry as we looked at this article by Pastor Brenda Martin in the Living Lutheran titled Beating Burnout and 10 Leadership Practices for Effective Ministry and how to apply those to all of the ministries at Trinity. Together, we enjoyed a wonderful time of fellowship over lunch, and in the afternoon, the SLT continued with a session on Deepening Connections at Trinity with a special focus on social and physical strategies to help disciples at Trinity be more inviting and deepen connections with each other. After the formal part of the day had ended, it was a joy for Trevor and me to host the team for a time of fellowship at the Pastor's House.

I can not say enough how grateful I am for our Shared Leadership Team members and their willingness to share their gifts and leadership in our congregation. Over the next few weeks, you will hear more, including a survey, as we continue to discern where God is leading us!


What is the Shared Leadership Team at Trinity?

Blood Pressure Screenings-Health Ministry

February is Heart Disease Awareness Month

- Heart disease is the leading cause of death in the U.S. for both men and women, with approximately 655,000 deaths per year or 1 in 4 deaths.
- Risk factors include family history, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes, obesity, and excessive alcohol use.
- Coronary heart disease is the most common type of heart disease. Every year approximately 805,000 Americans experience a heart attack. Congestive heart failure also affects 6.2 million people, causing 1 out of 9 deaths annually. Stroke is the leading cause of long-term disability.
- Prevention of heart disease includes monitoring of blood pressure, cholesterol, triglyceride levels, lifestyle modifications such as exercise, healthy diet, and management of risk factors.
- Monthly blood pressure screenings continue to be held at Trinity on the third Sunday of the month (February 18 and March 17) in room 122, from 9:45-10:45 am.

Afghanistan Refugees Today

The Alemi, Saddiq, Mahmoodi, Refahi, Razaqi and Kazimi families thank you!



Two years ago, in February 2022, we welcomed three adult Afghani refugees to our Lansdale community. Today we are supporting twenty people in six households. Two are now adorable toddlers who were born here in the summer of 2022.

Trinity has been instrumental in the progress they have made. The monetary gifts provided by the congregation have allowed them to live in safe housing, meet medical and dental expenses that occur regularly and cover some unexpected expenses. Gifts-in-kind from congregation members and friends in the community have furnished these six homes with many household items.

Highlights:

- The adults in all families are employed in one or more jobs.
- Most adults have driver's licenses. All households have their own cars. The weekly transportation trips have decreased from over 40 at one time to now when we only are needed for less than five.
- Five children are enrolled in NPSD from Kindergarten to 10th grade. Two young ones are enrolled in day care.
 All are flourishing in these new environments.
- They utilize support from community agencies like Mitzvah Circle Foundation, Keystone Opportunities Center, Feast and Care and Share.
- Their English skills continue to improve.
- Eight refugees have permanent resident status (Green Cards). Asylum has been granted to another six while four others are still classified as humanitarian parolees. This continues to be an unsettling and confusing process.
- Three families are hoping to bring additional family members here soon.

We are thrilled to watch them as they work toward independence. They have formed a community amongst themselves, caring for each other and sharing in difficult times and celebrations. As Trinity accompanies them through this process, we rejoice in their successes and will continue to walk with them.





Upcoming SEPA Synod Bishop Election Trinity Disciples,

At this year's upcoming Synod Assembly (May 3-4, 2024), the Southeastern Pennsylvania (SEPA) Synod will be electing a new Bishop, as Bishop Patricia Davenport has announced she will not be seeking a re-election.

The process of electing a Bishop is quite strenuous, and involves lots of wonderful volunteers—lay and rostered alike—coming together to prepare the Synod, the congregations, and the individuals for the election and the "what's next?" that follows.

The Synod Mission Profile, which is based on the results of a survey of synod members and leaders and interviews with Bishop Davenport and other key leaders, was published by the Synod Transition Team on January 8, 2024.

From my experience at E! 2024 in New Orleans, Louisiana:

Thanks to Trinity's Endowment Committee for their support, I had the wonderful opportunity to attend the 2024 ELCA Youth Ministry Network's Extravaganza! (E!) Conference in New Orleans, Louisiana, from January 18th to 21st. The theme for this year's conference was "DREAM!," and, goodness, did we all dream of the possibilities of our ministries together!

Each year, the E! brings together Youth Ministry Leaders from across the country who are working to grow the faith of our children, youth, families, and young adults through programming, teaching, youth groups, worship, and more. In the years when there is an ELCA Youth Gathering taking place, the E! is hosted in the same city as the Gathering, to allow leaders to explore the Gathering city ahead of the event. Throughout the conference, I had the pleasure of attending workshops that reminded us the importance of working with youth, and the challenges we face in the year 2024 (and beyond) in our work.

During our General Sessions throughout the conference, we celebrated various leadership milestones, even having a laying of hands/blessing for those of us who have just started our ministries. We heard from a distinguished theologian, Dr. Michael Chan, who spoke to us about Scripture and learning to DREAM BIG for our ministry. I connected with leaders from across the country and even had the chance to connect with folks in our own backyard from churches in Bethlehem, Havertown, Chester Springs, and Philadelphia, PA.

I'm finding in ministry it can sometimes seem exhausting when things aren't going the way we've planned. It can be easy, at times, to lose hope for the future. This experience certainly reignited my hope, and learning from others across Synods and states and realizing so many of us have the same passion and face the same struggles is fascinating, to say the least.

I also had the opportunity to participate in a 7.5-mile-long scavenger hunt across New Orleans that introduced us to places we'll encounter when we are in NOLA for the Youth Gathering. This was a great time to get a "lay of the land" before bringing our youth to NOLA on July 13th-20th.

January 15 - Rise Against Hunger

For the second time in as many years Trinity hosted Rise Against Hunger's Meal Packaging event. Due to last year's overwhelming response, and support by Trinity's Endowment Fund, we were able to package 5,000 more meals for a total of 15,120 meals in approximately 90 minutes. We had over 130 volunteers, forty-five more volunteers than in 2023.

Volunteers arrived at 8:30 am to lift heavy equipment and fifty pound bags of rice, meal supplements and soy into Hyson Hall. Meal packing tables, weigh and sealing stations and boxing stations were set up. Each complete box that is shipped overseas contains 36 packaged meals which is 216 servings and will feed one school aged child for an entire year. Multi-generations were all able to participate to make this a successful service event. Many volunteers from the community joined Trinity members for the day which made it all the more special. Thanks to all who volunteered their time and to Trinity's Endowment Fund for supporting this Day of Service.



Janke Scholarship

A number of years ago the Janke family, members of our church, set up a trust to provide educational scholarships for Trinity's graduating seniors.

The scholarship shall be awarded annually to a Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church (TLC) member who is a graduating high school senior planning on continuing higher education. The recipient shall exemplify truthfulness, fairness, the ability to build good will and friendships and provide mutually beneficial experiences to all concerned.

Applications are to be submitted to the Endowment Program Committee by March 15th each year. Recommendations for award recipients will be made to Congregation Council and voted on for approval at the April Council meeting. The award is presented in May.

Criteria for selection is based on the following:

- The student has shared generously of their time and talents with the ministry of TLC during their high school years.
- The student has successfully completed the requirements to graduate from high school and has been accepted to an accredited institution of higher learning.
- The student reflects the character and spirit of the Janke Family Trust Educational Scholarship Fund outlined above.
- 4. The Committee will also consider the student's financial need and their efforts made to balance work, school and church involvement.
- 5. The student shows a commitment to faith and the worship life of the church.
- 6. The student's involvement in their community and service organizations.

FEAST Community Meal & Food Pantry, Showing Generosity to the Lansdale Community!



Trinity's FEAST Community Meal and Food Pantry is making a difference for hundreds of families every month. A weekly meal, usually on Wednesday nights, has been a tradition at our church for many years. The Pandemic brought a halt to the fellowship and outreach FEAST provided. However, the ministry returned with a new and more robust format in 2021. The Generosity Team wishes to highlight the outstanding work God is doing through this ministry at Trinity.

What does this new, reimagined FEAST look like? The FEAST Community Meal and Food Pantry now takes place on Monday evenings. Responding to the increased need in our community, FEAST's leaders implemented a ticketing system to make the delivery of meals more efficient. Guests can even take home a meal to enjoy later. A food pantry is also available in Hyson Hall for families looking to bring groceries home. Every week features a different array of food donated by several area stores.

This is an enormous undertaking serving many families who are in need. Nearly 5,500 guests came for a meal and groceries in 2023, a large increase over the 1,370 who came in the first year of the relaunched program. In 2023 FEAST served 9,683 meals, an average of 186 per week. Of course, this isn't possible without a dedicated corps of volunteers who pick up the donated food, prepare and serve the meals, clean up from the meals, and distribute groceries. As the program has expanded, the number of volunteers has risen as well, from 473 in

2021 to 1,808 in 2023 (or an average of 35 each week).

God is good, and God's work is manifest in the generosity that makes FEAST possible. The hours these volunteers give is certainly a great example of that generosity. FEAST's leaders, among them Mark Lanan, Lindsay Beuke, Susan Delp, Heide Pickens, and Leslie Johnson, offer their talent of organization to this endeavor. Various local grocery markets donate thousands of dollars of food every week. And we are blessed to have the facilities in Hyson Hall which makes this undertaking possible.

It's possible you haven't had a chance to personally check out the FEAST Community Meal and Food Pantry. If so, check it out on a Monday. You'll see a meaningful way in which Trinity's time, talent, and treasure is making a difference in the North Penn community.


