Dear Trinity Disciples,

As we leave the heat of summer and turn to cooler days, I am incredibly grateful, humbled, and proud of all that has happened in our congregation over the past couple of months. As you read this edition of the *Lansdale Lutheran*, join me in giving thanks to God for all the ways that God has been at work through our congregation. From recaps of VBS, Music Camp,

ASP, the Youth Gathering, the Loft Dedication, Block Party, and so much more--thanks be to God!!

At the same time, I am encouraged and hopeful about what will come over the next few months at Trinity. I give thanks for the restart of Sunday School, youth groups, Bible Studies, choirs, our interfaith Thanksgiving Service, the installation of a new Bishop, and the first fall of having two called pastors since 2015. As I look ahead in these last four months of 2024, I am reminded of the opening words of chapter 3 of 1 John. In 1 John 3:1-2, we read, "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known."

These words were first penned by the author in the first century and were written to the Church so that their joy would "be full" (1:4). They would avoid sin (2:1), be aware of false teachers (2:26) and know God and God's love revealed in Jesus (5:13). This letter was written with the understanding that Christ could return at any moment and that God's people should be ready, be alert, and while they have yet to know God fully they will when God returns in glory. The Church was in a place of transition and discernment, and the author was encouraging the Church to recognize the days they were living in.

At Trinity, we find ourselves in the same place as the early church. We are in a place of discernment and are still not what we will be. We eagerly await God's return in fullness and are not yet complete as the people of God. The work of the Strategic Design Team Task Force and Congregational Council is discerning where God is calling us into the future, knowing that we are not yet what we will be as a community, as a congregation, and as God's people.

Martin Luther, in his *Defense and Explanation of All the Articles*, put it this way:

"This life therefore is not righteousness, but growth in righteousness, not health, but healing, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise. *We are not yet what we shall be,* but we are growing toward it, the process is not yet finished, but it is going on, this is not the end, but it is the road. All does not yet gleam in glory, but all is being purified." As we look toward where God guides us as a congregation, we must recognize that growing as beloved children of God is not yet finished. This process won't be completed until

Christ returns, and in the meantime, we are promised the

presence of the Holy Spirit, who guides and inspires us.

That does not mean that the process is without speed

bumps, sand traps, or valleys, which I know we will

encounter, but as long as we keep our eyes on the cross and on Jesus Christ, who is the perfecter of our faith, we will not be led astray as God has promised to be with us every step of the way.

Each morning, as I begin my day, I pray for our community, the staff, and the congregation. If there is anything that I can pray for, please let me know. It is an honor to serve and partner with you in ministry.

# Making a Musical Impact Through Camp

God's gift of music changes lives!

Music can transform someone's mood from sorrow to joy as if by magic. Music can soothe, heal, uplift and inspire like nothing else.

If a transformative music experience is great, even greater is the opportunity to give the gift of music to children so that they can at once experience the joy of music and learn to develop skills that allow them to continue making music.

Transformation is what happened during our week of Music Camp - Hearts, Hands and Voices - offered here from July 8-11 in partnership with St. John's United Church of Christ. Our incredible clinician, Dr. Michael Burkhardt and a fabulous staff of teachers and shepherds, provided an experience that was impactful in so many ways!

Children shared in the joy of leading worship each day, playing drums, handbells, and Orff Instruments (xylophones and rhythm instruments). They learned that the Psalms are a means of expressing emotions, whether through spoken words or in song. Children created prayer petitions that allowed them to express their own emotions, and they learned song refrains that serve as a tool for communicating with God.

While it was evident that God was at work each day during camp, the proof of the positive impact on campers came directly from their mouths.

Earlier in the day, Trudy and I saw evidence of her quietly helping a young man refocus his attention on the teacher's instructions. Hence, we were not surprised by her interest in mentoring and her leadership in helping others. Playing drums with these 5th graders also enables her to be one of their group.

It is no wonder that she and her choir members smile from ear to ear, as we have observed from their performances in concert. They not only empower fellow students but audiences as well.



#### Gently-Used Musical Instrument Drive Gives New Opportunities to **Eager Students September 15-October 4** Trinity's Racial Justice and Justice Through Music ministries are seeking gently used musical instruments in support of Musicopia's donation drive. Musicopia is a non-profit organization that repairs and refurbishes

musical instruments for use by the children of the Philadelphia public schools. These donations will give children, who lack the resources to purchase or rent one of their own, the opportunity to learn and play an instrument. This statewide initiative has collected over 6,000 instruments and operated in the Philadelphia region since 2002. Instruments accepted: brass/wind, guitar, keyboard, strings, percussion, full drum sets (adults), electronic keyboards. Not accepted: large instruments like pianos, console organs, accordions, toy drum sets, and sheet music. Instruments can be dropped off September 15 through October 4 prior to worship services or during weekly business hours.

## TRINITY'S GENEROSITY LIST

"And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that you may share abundantly in every good work." 2 Corinthians 9:8

Trinity's introduction of the Generosity List has taken place. The first project for our list is the purchase of two new altar candles for our chapel. One donation has been made; \$375 remains to be donated so the candles can be procured and installed. Several other needs have been identified: New carpet tiles, office lighting upgrades to reduce electricity usage, and table and chair replacements. More info will follow for these and how disciples can help.

Some of you recall Trinity's Wishing Well. First introduced around 1995, the Wishing Well was a posted list of projects seeking funding within our congregation.

The variety of projects included small scholarship items, sponsorships,

outreach needs, purchases to support ministries, and modest building projects. Trinity disciples who donated had the option of being recognized in an upcoming report.

This list has been re-branded as the Trinity's Generosity List, as it has become another means by which disciples connect resources with our mission of serving Christ.

Trinity's Generosity team will regularly post a list of such needs. The Generosity Team will review the suggested needs for suitability, will post, and will also connect willing donors with these needs. Donors need not commit to the full amount but may choose to fund a portion of a project's cost.

# Once again Trinity has demonstrated that it is a generous congregation!



Trinity's financial budget for 2024 was presented at the annual meeting in February and it forecasted expenses exceeding income by \$158,530.

Our congregation is able to support a short-term deficit such as this due to money reserves in our general fund. But just like our household budgets, we cannot continue in a deficit state indefinitely. Balance must be achieved between giving and expense levels.

In early April, an anonymous family committed a match challenge for offering levels during the months of April, May, and June. It worked this way: If the general offering budget for these three months of \$264,000 was exceeded, the donor family would match the excess, up to \$25,000.

It is with delight and gratitude to announce that the maximum match was achieved! Actual offering was \$322,771 or 22% above.

Generous giving of treasure by MANY Trinity disciples has shone forth again! Since the accounting of these results was completed in July, the match gift of \$25,000 was received and will be credited in July, providing a strong start to the second half of this year. This level of offering will help to reduce Trinity's 2024 deficit.

These results will help toward balancing our budget. Trinity's ministries are both within and outside of four walls, and well beyond. We are grateful for your purposedriven giving of treasure, and time and talent.

## Working Together — Asking God for Guidance Along the Way

In a Minute Mission on August 10-11, Bill Shimer, Council President reminded us of the many blessings, challenges and changes Trinity has experienced over the last five years. We have called two new pastors; reenergized our worship, faith formation and music programming; and have created new ministries to bring the Kingdom of God here on earth!

Although we are a vibrant church, our post pandemic challenges are a reality. We have fewer people worshiping and engaging in our ministries and our reduced numbers have resulted in an operating budget that consistently exceeds our income, leaving us with a systemic deficit.

While further actions are being taken to encourage income, earlier this year the Council commissioned the Strategic Design Task Force\* (SDTF) to make recommendations regarding the staffing design of our church, address both emerging and evolving needs and the financial pressures we are experiencing. To assist the SDTF we have retained LEAD, a non-profit organization who has worked with other larger Lutheran churches to address these issues and concerns. On August 16-18 ELCA Deacon Peggy Hahn, Executive Director of LEAD, visited Trinity and spent time meeting with our staff, Council and SDTF to learn about our congregation and staff organization. LEAD will provide recommendations for our consideration.

As we move forward in this journey together, let us do so knowing that our good and gracious God will be with us and guide us through this important work.

## A Successful Kids Summer Food Bag Program

This summer Trinity teamed up with the Bean Bag Food Program (BBFP) to collect shelf stable food for children in our neighborhoods who have limited access to nutritious meals. During the school year the BBFP provides weekly bags of food to children in our community who face food insecurity on the weekends. The program has been in existence since 2016 and in the fall of 2023 expanded into the North Penn School District. Hatfield and Oak Park were initially identified as schools which would benefit most from the program. A third North Penn elementary school will be added this fall. Their mission is to stop hunger so kids can focus. learn and succeed when they return to school on Monday morning.

Thanks to the generosity of Trinity members, we collected over 27 overflowing bags of food this summer in addition to several cases of food used in the bags. A heartfelt thank you to everyone who contributed! These bags were hand–delivered to NP children who participated in the BBFP last year, helping to supplement their food until the school year begins.

Thanks to Kim Wreath for all the help she gave me this summer with this initiative. Again, thanks to all the Trinity disciples who helped feed some of our neighborhood children this summer. # Overcoming Fear Through Faith: A Look Back at Trinity's Vacation Bible School

What do you do when you're afraid? At Trinity's Vacation Bible School (VBS), the answer is simple: put your trust in God. This year's VBS theme, "Camp Firelight: A Summer Adventure with God," centered around Psalm 56:3, "Whenever I'm afraid, I will put my trust in You." This theme resonated deeply with both the children and the staff.

Amy Hawthorne, who directed VBS for the first time this year, admitted feeling a mix of excitement and apprehension. "As my first time directing VBS, I was definitely on edge," she shared. "I had heard the stories of VBS's past and how amazing they were, so the bar was set high." This year, 158 enthusiastic participants registered for the event, which ran from June 24-28. The age range of the attendees spanned from Pre-kindergarten (age 4) to 6th grade (age 11). Notably, Pre-kindergarten was a new addition this year, and it was heartwarming to see our youngest attendees engaging in activities alongside the older kids. The program also included accommodations for children with special needs, affirming Trinity's commitment to inclusivity— "All Are Welcome."

The event saw the dedicated efforts of over 60 volunteers, whose contributions ranged from planning and teaching to managing the various activities. This collective effort mirrored the teamwork seen at any well-organized camp. Each day, the children rotated through seven engaging stations: crafting, music, Bible storytelling, reflection, science, snack time, and recreation. The craft and recreation stations were particularly noteworthy, as they were designed and led by two of Trinity's Teen Troupe youth, fostering a sense of leadership and creativity among our teens.

One of the highlights of the week was the cross-generational collaboration. It was inspiring to witness participants ranging from ages 4 to 29+ coming together to learn about God's word and experience God's love and presence. This blend of ages and experiences fostered a vibrant and supportive environment.

Amy recounted a touching moment that demonstrated God's work during VBS. On the first day, a young child was reluctant to leave her mom, despite her older sister's attempts to comfort her. With some encouragement to try the science station, the child had so much fun that she was eager to stay with her group for the rest of the day.



Later, another child arrived from swim practice, hesitant to part from her dad. After observing the activities and meeting the first child, she was comforted by the words, "I was afraid at first, but I'm not anymore." This led to a budding friendship between the two girls, who found joy in each other's company throughout the week.

Another highlight was the community service project supporting the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP). Participants contributed toys, crafts, games, and stuffed animals, resulting in a collection of 400 items for children unable to attend camp due to illness. This project was a lesson in generosity and empathy, reinforcing the value of giving back.

Overall, this year's VBS was a resounding success. The positive outcomes include: increased church attendance from VBS families, parents seeking baptisms for their children, and requests for Bibles and first communions. The hope is that each participant carries the lesson learned throughout the school year: when faced with fear, they can put their trust in God and find reassurance in their faith.







This summer, Trinity continued its tradition of sending a group to the Appalachia Service Project (ASP) to work on repairing homes. We were thrilled to be a part of their mission, to "make homes warmer, safer, and drier." The group of twelve individuals set off in two vans for a hot but wonderful week in the Guyan Valley of West Virginia. On the way, we stayed at Luther Memorial in Blacksburg, VA, who always is a generous host. The first night at the center was spent getting to know the dozens of other groups from across the US, as we sang John Denver's "Country Roads" and wondered what the week would hold in store for us.

Monday morning we took off as two separate crews, getting to meet two different home owners and the projects we were taking on for the week. One group met an 84-year-old woman named Myrtle, and learned about the room they were renovating. The other group met another woman in her late 50's and her two young grandsons,

and found out about the housing "hug system" of installation that would be installed on her trailer. Throughout the week, both groups built relationships with their homeowners, and the reality of what it is like to love & serve our neighbors as Christians. Despite a different culture, God brought us together with them, and richly blessed all of us in the new relationships.

Within our own group, relationships grew deeper as well. Getting ice cream every night, playing Kubb or Frisbee, sharing in frustrations and joys in the work, and so much more allowed us to genuinely know one another. On the final night, as each person was asked to share with the group at the center how they

saw God at work through the week, one of our youth responded,


