Offerings for the month of August dropped below last year's total, and Trinity ended August 2024 year-to-date with a deficit. We expect offerings to be strong in the coming months. Due to increased giving and a reduction in expenses from utilities and other areas, the Finance Committee is forecasting the 2024 deficit to be approx. \$50,000 instead of the planned deficit of \$121,632.


