We offer a sign of peace to each other using sign language, a wave, an elbow bump, or hand shake. The Sanctus (meaning Holy) gives us the opportunity to join together with the heavenly chorus in praising God, who is wondrous yet calls us into relationship.

Lord, remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray.


