Offerings through November were above last year's total, and Trinity ended November 2024 Year-to-date with a deficit. Due to increased giving and a reduction in expenses from utilities and other areas, the Finance Committee is forecasting the 2024 deficit to be approximately \$50,000 instead of the planned deficit of \$121,632.

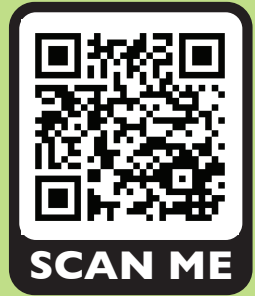




