Dear Trinity Disciples,

At our annual meeting in February, the theme for 2025, "Shining God's Light," was shared. Shining God's Light is based on Matthew 5:14-16 which reads.

"Here's another way to put it: You're here to be light, bringing out the God-colors in the world. God is not a secret to be kept. We're going public with this, as public as a city on a hill. If I make you light-bearers, you don't think I'm going to hide you under a bucket, do you? I'm putting you on a light stand. Now that I've put you there on a hilltop, on a light stand—shine! Keep open house; be generous with your lives. By opening up to others, you'll prompt people to open up with God, this generous Father in heaven."

These words, penned by Saint Matthew, are part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7). In this part of the sermon, Jesus calls the disciples of the first century and each of us today to continue the ministry that he began. As Christians, we are not to hide our faith but to live out our faith boldly.

Each time we welcome a sibling to God's family in the waters of baptism, the Assisting Minister lights a candle from the Paschal Candle and hands it to the newly baptized or to one of their baptism sponsors. The light from the Paschal candle symbolizes the light of Jesus Christ, dispelling darkness and symbolizing new life and hope.

As the lit candle is passed, the Assisting Minister proclaims,

"Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

This powerful sentence is a reminder and a call to live our lives. We are called to shine God's light and let our light shine. We are called to receive and reflect God's love that has come to us through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

In baptism, our identity is sealed as children of God, and each of us promises the Holy Spirit's presence in our lives, whether we are 6 months, 6 years, 66 years, or 106 years old. During this year, we will focus on how we are called as individuals, as a congregation, and as God's Children, God's family, to shine God's light in the world.

Dear Trinity, may your light shine in the world so that all may know the love of God, who calls us his own.


